# BACK-GROUND

Architects 49 was established in 1983. With the overriding objective to provide truly professional and comprehensive architectural services. These services cover a wide range of related activities, including urban planning, preparing of master plans, architectural design and construction management. The company also provides counseling on the feasibility and viability of a project, and on prospects for its development and management. Since the founding of the company, teamwork has been a watchword. Architects 49 implemented a "studio approach" in 1991 to enhance the emphasis on the team. Each studio must answer directly to the firm's President and Executive Committee who scrutinize the quality of performance. In addition, project directors meet regularly to exchange views and discuss problems of mutual concern. These procedures ensure that each project receives individual attention and benefits from the collective experiences and resources of Architects 49.

# BOARD OF DIRECTORS



NITHI STHAPITANONDA

Founder

In 1971, Nithi received his Bachelor of Architecture from Chulalongkorn University. He continued his education with a Master of Architecture from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign in 1973. During graduate school he received the top award in the International Symposium on Housing in the "Housing for Older Adults, Utica, New York" Competition. In that year, he also began his professional practice in Washington DC with Metcalf and Associates. Later, together with a team of professors and students from the Universities of Illinois and Wisconsin, Nithi was granted a fellowship for research in India.

In 1974. Nithi returned to Thailand where he worked with Design 103 for nine years before leaving to establish his own practice. He founded Architects 49 in 1983. leading the firm to win several gold medals for best architectural design from the Association of Siamese Architects (ASA) under Royal Patronage, Nithi excels in serving his profession through his capacity for leadership, and was President of A49 until the end of 2012, when he semi-retired from his profession. Since then, he has become the Chairman of the Board of Directors for Architects 49.

He has pioneered a contemporary style of Thai architecture that enhances international modernism with appropriate adaptations from local tradition. In works ranging from houses to high-rises and museums, his efforts show great sensitivity to nature, climate and culture. Nithi has consistently advanced his creativity with Thai inspiration in mind.

Beyond his leadership as a practitioner, he has also played an important role as a President of the ASA during 1992-1994 and as Secretary General and a Board Member of the Council of Thai Architects from 2000 to 2003. His contribution to these organisations has helped new standards and regulations being set up that enhance the architectural profession and design of the built environment in Thailand. For these reasons, the Ministry of Culture named him a National Artist in Contemporary Architecture in 2002.

Nithi was appointed as an Honorary Member of the Japan Institute of Architects (Hon. FJIA) in 1995 and an Honorary Fellow of the American Institute of Architects (Hon. FAIA) in the USA in 2008

During 2008-2012. Nithi became a Member of the Council of Silapakorn University. From 2008 until the present time, he has been active as a Committee Member of Bangkok University and was also Member of the Board of Directors of Vajiravudh College during the period 2009-2014. In 2013, Nithi received an Honorary Doctorate degree in Science, in the field of Architecture, from Sripratum University.

### PRABHAKORN VADANYAKUL

President / Managing Director



In 1980, Prabhakorn received his Bachelor of Architecture degree from Chulalongkorn University. He continued his education at the Catholic University of America in Washington DC, where he graduated with a Master of Architecture degree in 1984. Whilst in Washington DC, Prabhakorn worked at Robert Schwinn & Associates in Maryland before returning to Thailand and joining A49 in 1985. At A49, he has been responsible for a wide range of projects ranging from mega complexes and highrise buildings to houses. Most of these are located in Thailand, whilst others are located in other countries in the region, including: China, Malaysia, Singapore and Vietnam. His work has also extended outside that region, for example, to the United Arab Emirates and India. All add breadth to the A49 portfolio of work. His main role has been to establish major policies, design concepts and strategic planning initiatives. He was appointed as President of Architects49 Phuket in 2005 and President of Architects49 International in 2006.

Prabhakorn actively served the Association of Siamese Architects (ASA) as its Head of Public Relations from 1992 to 1994, as its Vice President of Foreign Affairs from 1995 to 1997, and as the President of ASA during 2002-2004. He has also participated in many subcommittees for both the ASA and the Architect Council of Thailand (ACT). He is an active Council Member of the ACT, with his present duties for them extending into 2018. He has been an Honorary member of the Japan Institute of Architects (JIA) since 2003.

Prabhakorn has been a key member of A49 since its foundation, and has the honour of being trusted by Nithi Sthapitanonda (the Founder of A49) to be President and Managing Director of 49Group.

Executive Director / Office Manager


